A reminder of the story

A farmer finds a baby eagle, who has fallen out of his nest, and takes him home to his farm. He tries to make the eagle fly but he cannot as the eagle spends all his time with the chickens. The eagle now thinks he is a chicken. The farmer's friend decides he has to get the eagle to fly.

To plan an alternative ending

Possible Alternative Endings

- The eagle finds its family
- The eagle can fly but wants to live with the chickens
- The eagle flies off but lives nearby and keeps returning to the farm
- The eagle cannot fly but can glide and enjoys being an eagle for a brief time once a week when the friend takes him up the mountain

You can pick one of these endings or make up your own!

Types of endings

- Happy endings – Where everything works out.
- Twists- Something unexpected happens.
- Cliff hanger- You keep your reader of the edge of their seat by leaving the ending open.
- However you choose to end your story, make it interesting!

Your task plan

Today, all challenges must type a **plan for their alternative ending**, in **bullet points**, on the weekly word document.

Remember that your plan has to be useful when you come to writing your alternative ending tomorrow.

A plan should consist of bullet points containing key words about what will happen in your alternative ending step by step.
