

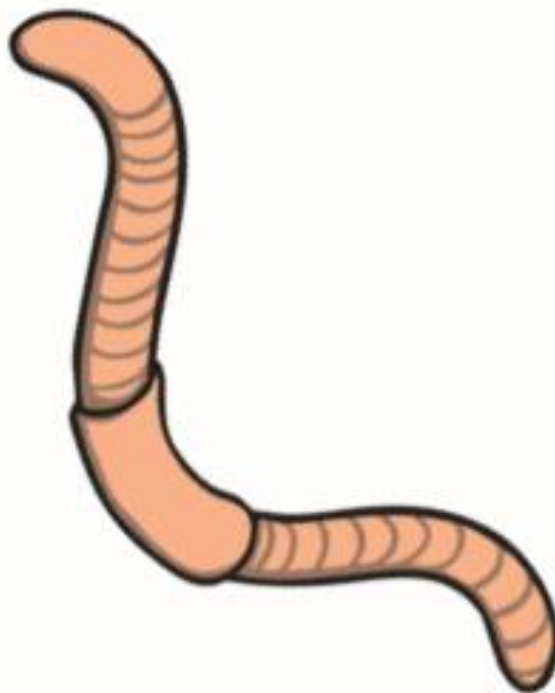
Day 1 Watch the video. Learn this poem by heart.
