Day 3

By the end of this week you will have written a **newspaper report about the clouds** in the sky.

Today you must **plan** your newspaper report.

The report should be about the different shaped clouds in the sky that no one has ever seen before.

Your job is to tell people about this magnificent event in your report.

Plan

- To plan your newspaper report you must use the '**Day 3- Plan Template**' on the website.
- The next few slides on this PowerPoint will help you with each step of the plan giving you ideas of what to include.



Step 1: Name of the newspaper and the headline for your report

You need a **name for your newspaper**. This can be one you have made up or one that already exists.

You then need a **headline** for your story. It should use alliteration, a pun or rhyme.

Examples:

The crowds were watching the clouds

Crowds chasing clouds

Step 2: Introduction

Your introduction must include the 4Ws (Who, what, where and when).

Who was there? (Crowds watching the clouds and the boy and his Grandad)

What happened? (Lots of different shaped clouds floating in the sky. People were fascinated and began to watch the clouds. Lots of different shapes appeared like... The clouds were made by the boy and his Grandad because...)

Where did it happen? (You can make up a place name)

When did it happen? (Morning? Afternoon? What date?)

Step 3: Eyewitnesses

- You need at least 2 eye witnesses.
- You could interview people who saw the clouds. Think about what their **answers** would be to the following questions. What did they say to you about the clouds? What did they see? How did they feel? Where do they think they came from?
- You could also interview the cloud maker and/or his grandson! Why did they make the clouds in different shapes? How did he think people would react? Will they do it again?

Step 4: Final paragraph

- What are people doing now? (E.g. People are travelling from all over the world to witness the clouds and the cloud maker continues to make clouds in a variety of shapes.)
- What might happen in the future? (Here you could end your report with a question like: Will more shapes appear in the sky? Will they stop? OR you can speculate what you think might happen.)
